#1 in Ivy League all-time for longest punt return - 92 yards v Colgate in 1963

Set Ivy League record at the time for rushing yards in a game - 182 v Cornell in 1963

#1 in Ivy League for rushing yards per attempt in 1963 - 5.9 yards (109 for 638)

### **Cosmo Iacavazzi, Class of 1965**

#1 in nation and in Ivy League in 1963 for rushing touchdowns -14

#6 in nation and #1 in Ivy League in 1964 for rushing touchdowns- 9

#20 in Ivy League all-time for rushing touchdowns in a career -31

#10 in Ivy League all-time for rushing touchdowns in Ivy League games - 28

#1 in Ivy League in rushing yards for a season in 1964 - 909 yards

#1 in Ivy League in rushing yards per attempt in 1964 -5.3 yards (164 for 909)

#7 for Princeton all-time for most points scored in a career -186 points

#6 for Princeton all-time for most points scored in a season – 84 in 1964

#7 for Princeton all-time for rushing touchdowns in a career - 30 (1962-1964)

#7 for Princeton all-time for rushing touchdowns in a season -14 in 1963

#10 for Princeton all-time for most carries in a career – 396 carries for 1895 yards

#9 for Princeton all-time for most yards per carry in a career- 4.79 yards

### **Ron Landeck, Class of 1966**

#1 for Princeton all-time for most average yards gained per kickoff return in a career – 27.1 yards in 1963-1965 (13 for 352)

#7 in nation and #1 in Ivy League for total offense in a season – 1949 yards in 1965 (breaking Dick Kazmaier's 1951 record and holding Princeton all-time record until 1981)

#3 in nation and #1 in Ivy League in 1965 and #6 for Princeton all-time for most touchdowns responsible in a season – 24 touchdowns in 1965 (13 passing and 11 rushing)

#2 in nation in 1965 for passing efficiency in a season – 139

#2 in nation and #1 in Ivy League for most passing yards per attempt in a season – 7.9 yards in 1965

# 9 in nation in 1965 , # 2 for Princeton all-time and #1 in Ivy League in 1965 for most yards gained per completion in a season– 14.7 yards in 1965 (1099 yards on 75 completions)

#8 in nation and #1 in Ivy League in 1965 and #6 for Princeton all-time for most passing touchdowns in a season – 13 touchdowns in 1965

#2 for Princeton all-time for highest percentage of touchdown passes in a season – 9% in 1965 (13 of 144)

#6 for Princeton all-time for touchdown passes in a game - 4 in 1965 v Brown

#1 in Ivy League in 1965 for most rushing yards in a season – 850 yards (on 188 attempts)

#1 in Ivy league in 1965 and #6 for Princeton all-time for most rushing touchdowns in a season - 11 touchdowns

#1 in Ivy League in 1965 for most points scored in a season – 66 points

### **Lauson Cashdollar, Class of 1966**

#1 in Ivy League for receiving touchdowns in 1965 – 5 touchdowns

#1 in Ivy League history to 1965 for receptions in a game -11 v Harvard 1965

### **Bill Berkley, Class of 1967**

#1 in Ivy League in 1965 in average yards per punt in a season – 41.6 yards

### **Charlie Gogolak, Class of 1966**

#3 in nation all-time, #1 in Ivy League all-time and #1 for Princeton all-time for field goals made in a game - 6 v Rutgers in 1965

#1 all-time in Ivy League for points scored by kicking in a game -20 v Rutgers in 1965 (6 FGs and 2 PATs)

#4 in Ivy League all-time and #3 for Princeton all-time for field goals made in a season - 16 in 1965

#7 in Ivy League all-time and #3 for Princeton for most points scored by kicking in a season - 81 in 1965 (16 FGs and 33 PATs)

#1 in Ivy League all-time and #1 for Princeton all-time for longest field goal made - 54 yards v Cornell and #2 for Princeton all-time for longest field goal made - 52 yards v Rutgers in 1965

#1 in nation all-time, #1 in Ivy League all-time and #1 in Princeton all-time for highest percentage of points made by kicking points after touchdown kicked in a season - 100% from 33 made of 33 PAT attempts in 1965

#5 for Princeton all-time for points after touchdown kicked in a season - 33 PATs in 1965

#4 for Princeton all-time for highest percentage of points after touchdown made in a career - 94.6% from 89 made of 94 PAT attempts in 1963-1965

### **John Bowers, Class of 1967**

#1 in Ivy League in 1965 for receiving touchdowns – 5 touchdowns

#1 for Princeton all-time in yards gained per reception in a season – 26.2 yards (262 yards on 10 receptions) in 1965

### **Doug James, Class of 1967**

#5 in Ivy League all-time and #2 for Princeton all-time for most yards gained by punt returns in a season - 365 yards (on 23 returns) in 1965

#3 for Princeton all-time for most yards gained by punt returns in a career – 591 yards on 36 returns in 1964 to 1966

#2 for Princeton all-time for most yards gained per game by punt returns in a season – 40.6 yards (365 yards in 9 games) in 1965

#2 for Princeton all-time for most yards gained per punt return in a season - 15.9 yards on 23 returns for 365 yards in 1965

#10 for Princeton all-time for most interceptions in a season – 5 in 1965
